#### STATUS REPORT ON COVID-19 - MARCH 2021

#### **FOCUS: AFRICA AND EAST & SOUTHERN AFRICA**

## 1. Executive Summary

This is our monthly analysis of the COVID-19 statistics in Africa and East and Southern Africa region as at mid-March 2021. What is unique about the last month is that it saw the COVID-19 vaccine rolled out in a number of our member countries, mainly the AstraZeneca vaccine. While lower doses were offered to the region, and continent at large, there has largely been low uptake of the vaccine among targeted groups – especially the health and other frontline workers. Various reports attribute this hesitancy to different reasons, including: a wait and see attitude, fears and beliefs, lower trust and confidence in the vaccine efficacy, and misinformation.

The report shares the statistics of the period mid-February and mid-March. It also summarizes the total number of cases, deaths, recoveries in the region and also the whole of Africa. It further gives the percentage increases in cases and deaths, active cases and critical cases between the months of February 2021 and March 2021.

## 2. Highest hit countries by cases in Africa and East and Southern Africa (ESA)

While cases have continued to increase, the last month (mid-February to mid-March) was an increase of 6.7% in cases compared to 18.1% the previous month.

Somalia was the hardest hit country in Africa in the period under review with **82.1%** increase in cases between mid- February 2021 & mid-March 2021, that is, from **5,183** to **9,183** cases

Ethiopia registered a **21.1% increase** in cases, from **147,092** to **178,108**, and becoming the hardest hit country in Africa with actual number increase of cases.

The table below shows the top five countries with the highest increase of cases for both Africa and East and Southern Africa over the comparative period. Notice that the ESA region members have been hardest it by the pandemic in Africa over the comparative period.

# 3. Highest hit countries by deaths in Africa and East and Southern Africa (ESA)

The top three countries in Africa that were most hit by number of deaths over the comparative period were ESA Region members. The continent registered a **6.4%** increase in deaths over the last one month (mid-February to mid-March 2021). This represents a significant decrease compared to the previous month which recorded **28.4%** increase in deaths.

Somalia recorded the highest rate increase of **153.3%** in deaths over the comparative period; that is from **152** to **385** deaths in one month. Egypt had the highest actual numbers increase in deaths from **9,994** to **11,384** deaths.

### 4. COVID-19 numbers in Africa

Reported new cases in Africa have increased by **6.7**% whereas in the deaths have increased by **6.4**%. Cases in Africa stand at **4,004,678** from **3,751,726** and deaths at **104,807** from **98,506** over the last one month; from mid-February 2021 to mid-March 2021.

The table below outlines the COVID-19 statistics.

Take note of the percentage change in cases and deaths recorded over the last month. Notice to the ESA countries are shaded light blue.
