STATUS REPORT ON COVID-19 – JULY 2021

FOCUS: AFRICA AND EAST & SOUTHERN AFRICA

1. Executive Summary

This is our monthly analysis of the COVID-19 statistics in Africa and East and Southern Africa region as at mid-July 2021.

The report shares the statistics of the period mid-June and mid-July. It also summarizes the total number of cases, deaths, recoveries in the region and also the whole of Africa. It further gives the percentage increases in cases and deaths, active cases and critical cases between the months of June 2021 and July 2021.

STATUS OF VACCINATION IN ESA AND AFRICA.

Vaccinations have remained comparatively low in East and Southern Africa, and Africa at large. According to the World Health Organization (WHO), Africa only accounts for 1% of the vaccine doses administered globally. With a population of about 1.3 billion people, only about 2% have received at least one dose (with less than 1% receiving the second dose or being fully vaccinated). The WHO adds that 7 of Africa's 54 countries—nearly 90%—are set to miss the September target of vaccinating 10% of their people unless Africa receives 225 million more doses.

It has been difficult to track the number of Customs officials in the region and in the continent that have been inoculated. In fact, while Customs officials are regarded as frontline officers, most have largely not been prioritised for vaccination (but for some Members), thanks to the low availability of vaccines. Most countries have focused on utilizing the limited doses to vaccinate their most vulnerable populations – based on age and preexisting health conditions.

2. Highest hit countries by cases in Africa and East and Southern Africa (ESA)

While cases have continued to increase, the last month (mid-June to mid-July) there was an increase of **20.4**% in cases compared to **8.7**% the previous month.

Liberia was the hardest hit country in Africa in the period under review with **100.2%** increase in cases between mid-June 2021 & mid-July 2021, that is, from **2,651** to **5,306** cases.

The ESA region was the hardest hit by percentage increase in cases with six countries among the top ten in Africa. These countries included Zimbabwe (95.6%), Rwanda (78.6%), Namibia (63.2%), Zambia (57.2%), Botswana (40.2%) and Uganda (38.1%). Some of these countries have introduced different levels of lockdown either nationally or in the most affected cities.

The table below shows the top five countries with the highest increase of cases for both Africa and East and Southern Africa over the comparative period. Notice that the ESA region members have been hardest it by the pandemic in Africa over the comparative period.

3. Highest hit countries by deaths in Africa and East and Southern Africa (ESA)

During the review period, ESA had eight out of top ten countries in Africa with an increase of numbers of deaths.

Uganda was the hardest hit in the period under review with an increase of 390%, from 459 to 2,249 deaths.

The continent registered a 16.5% increase in deaths over the last one month (mid-June to mid-July 2021).

The table below represents the top five countries with the highest increase of deaths for both Africa and East and Southern Africa over the comparative period.

4. COVID-19 numbers in Africa

Reported new cases in Africa have increased by **20.4**% whereas in the deaths have increased by **16.5**%. Cases in Africa stand at **6,115,400** from **5,077,536** and deaths at **155,456** from **135,480** over the last one month; from mid-June 2021 to mid-July 2021.

The table below outlines the COVID-19 statistics.

Take note of the percentage change in cases and deaths recorded over the last month. Take note that the ESA countries are shaded light blue.
